## Schedule of DLC families recorded in the 1820 census of the Commune of St Pierre-lès-Calais, Pas-de-Calais, France

The census (French: recensement) record document designated M3731 is held and conserved by the Pas-de-Calais France archives department. It is available to view on the Calais Archives website <http://www.archivespasdecalais.fr/Archives-en-ligne>

The page number (of 83) shown refers to the online census record.

The 1848 Migration heading indicates whether or not the person migrated to the Australian Colonies in 1848.

Sections and streets are not recorded in this census record.

The census record dated 20 December 1820 notes 4007 people living in the Commune of St Pierre-lès-Calais.
